Visiting Professor of Development Studies from a Political Science Perspective

(full time, for the period of 1 October 2018 – 30 September 2020) is to be filled.

The Visiting Professor will teach and research in the field of Development Studies from a specifically political science perspective. Expected are an extensive knowledge of discussions on development in political science, of theories and concepts of development, as well as empirical research in thematic fields of development from a political science perspective (e.g. Statehood in the Global South; Democracy and Development and/or Gender and Development).

Participation in Development Studies' transdisciplinary teaching and research as well as administrative tasks are expected. Responsibilities include in particular:

- Autonomous teaching in the field for master and doctoral programme as well as the extension curricula Development Studies to the extent of eight weekly hours/term.
- Supervision of students on all curricular levels (most notably master theses).

Successful candidates should have the following qualifications:

- Doctoral degree/PhD in the social sciences and post-doctoral experience in the field of Development Studies (mandatory) from a political science perspective at a university or other research institution
- Willingness and ability for inter- and transdisciplinary cooperation and knowledge of intersectional approaches
- Habilitation (venia docendi) in a subject field relevant to this position or an internationally accepted equivalent qualification is desirable
- Outstanding achievements in research, excellent publication record, international reputation
- Experience in designing, procuring and managing large research projects, as well as the willingness and ability to lead research groups
- Enthusiasm for excellent teaching, teaching experience at universities as well as the ability and willingness to teach students in all phases of their studies (extension curricula on a BA level, master and doctoral level), to supervise academic theses and to promoting young academic colleagues
- Excellent command of German and English, both written and spoken



We offer:
